


Number of FF's who die annually




COVID Claims Activity and Fatalities




Claims Received, Volume Comparison with COVID-19

Amount Paid/Incurred



Pursuit Ownership

Texas Peace Officers are expected to follow the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of their respective departments.

Call for Service:



- You are on patrol when you hear an officer begin a pursuit that is headed out of town. The primary dispatch channel is restricted, but you hear other officers en-route via the backup channel. Dispatch follows protocols and notifies the neighboring agency. Now you have multiple units from your agency and an unknown number of units from other agencies, all converging on the pursuit...
- Who has COMMAND?

Owning the Pursuit



- The decision to avoid apprehension and cause a pursuit to be initiated rests with the suspect.
- However, once a pursuit has begun, the responsibility to continue the pursuit rests with the pursuing officer and a supervisor who OWNS the pursuit.
- During the pursuit, the officer and the supervisor will constantly evaluate the need to continue the pursuit against the risk of injury to any innocent person, and all officers.

VINCIBLE Training



- Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC)
 - First program presented in August 2022
 - Six sessions have been provided
 - Course length increased from four to eight hours based on feedback from attendees and to better address the subject matter
 - Course is free, \$100 for IFAK
- Resilience Strategies for First Responders (7 hours) and Moving Right of Bang: Critical Incident Early Intervention Strategies (3 Hours)
 - First program in 2017
 - 66 sessions with 1,748 attendees
 - Provided through VINCIBLE not required to be a member of Risk Pool or TPCA

TPCA or TFCA Best Practices Recognition Programs



- Risk Pool will provide funding for first year fees of member agencies
 - TPCA's Law Enforcement Best Practices Accreditation Program
 - TFCA's Best Practices Recognition Program
 - Must have applicable coverages with the Risk Pool

Risk Pool Law Enforcement Outreach Consultant Role



- Historically, the Risk Pool has interacted with public safety departments primarily through risk management related training provided by training specialists
- Transitioning Law Enforcement Training Specialist position to Law Enforcement Outreach Consultant and hiring additional consultant
- Primary duties:
 - Develop and maintain relationships with law enforcement leaders
 - Utilize experience and knowledge to influence change
 - Utilize and leverage data to analyze related loss trends and exposures
 - Develop effective and motivational risk management focused training
